## BEHRING SEA FISHERIES.

NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN ENGLAND AND  
THE UNITED STATES RESUMED.

*Irish-American Capitalists Propose to Establish Industries  
in Ireland—Families Flee Before the Indians—Opium  
Dens Raided in New York—Floods in Kentucky.*

WASHINGTON, June 14.—The Behring Sea trouble has taken a new and favourable turn, and negotiations are actively advancing upon the initiative of the United States. The two Governments are still apart upon matters of detail, but every confidence is felt at the State Department that the necessary bases of a settlement just to this country will be arranged within a very short time. While these negotiations give such a hopeful promise, our Government will avoid awkward occurrences in the Behring Sea. The cutters still await final orders.

WASHINGTON, June 14.—The United States has made a proposition which promises a favourable and speedy settlement of the pending Behring Sea question. There is confidence at the State Department that a settlement just to this country will be arranged shortly. It is known positively that if the Revenue vessels had left without modified instructions England would order the North Pacific fleet into Behring Sea to protect Canadian vessels.
