OTTAWA, 23rd November, 1910-

Sir-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 14th Ultimo, relative to the desire of Widow Nabache, Angelique, to lease to her son-in-law, D'Assises Villeneuve her land "Lot 23, Range A, Oulatchouan Indian Reserve", and in reply to say that, first, while the land in question was so described in Survey of 1880, it is now, according to survey by P. Horace Dumais, P. L. S., made in 1892, described as lots 23 and A, Con A, the combined areas of these two lots being that contained in Location Ticket No 262, second- if the Widow Nabache and her daughters are, as would appear to be the case, the sole heirs of the original Locatee, the Department sees no objection to the land being leased, as desired, in view of your strong recommendation in favour of the man Villeneuve.

You should obtain and forward to the Department an agreement, embodying the conditions of Lease, having the same distinctly understood by both parties, by whom it should be signed, upon receipt of which the question of issue of Lease will receive immediate consideration.
