
Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 5th instant enclosing the resignation of Miss Annie McDougal as teacher of the Bear Creek Indian School and stating that you have received a letter from a young lady from Middlemiss, who is at present attending High School, stating that she would like the position of teacher in this school.

In reply I beg to say that Miss McDougal's resignation is accepted.

The young lady to whom you refer should forward her application for the position, stating her age and religion and whether she has had any experience in teaching and, if satisfactory, the Department will be prepared to appoint her temporarily at a salary at the rate of \$400.00 per annum. She should also forward copies of any testimonials that she may have.
