The undersigned begs to state that the Canadian Korthern Pacific Railway Company has applied to the Department of Indian Affairs for right of way, to comprise an area of 9.36 acres, through the Fopkum Indian reserve, in the Lytton Indian agency, in the Yale district of the province of British Columbia, and has furnished a plan of the right of way on which there is a certificate of the Chief Engineer of the Department of Railways & Canals that the land applied for is actually required for railway purposes and is such as the company should be allowed to acquire under the 46th section of the Indian Act.

The undersigned would recommend that, under the said section 46 of the Indian Act, the Canadian Northern Pacific Railway Company be allowed to acquire from the Department of Indian Affairs the Indians' interest in the right of way referred to, upon such terms as may be agreed upon.
