## Border-Crossing Cards for Aliens and Citizens

Aliens and citizens residing on either side of the international boundaries who habitually cross and recross the boundaries upon legitimate pursuits may apply to the officer of this Service in charge at the border port where last admitted for a border-crossing identification card. The granting of these identification cards is discretionary with that officer, and such cards may be taken up or cancelled by him at any time for good and sufficient cause.

## Certificate of Registry asxamandadxingustxXxxi939.

pursuant to the provisions of the act approved March 2, 1929, as amended August 7, 1939, a certificate of registry is issued to an alien in whose behalf the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization has authorized the creation of a record of registry. Such record may be created in the case of any alien not ineligible to citizenship who writered the United States before July 1, 1924, who has resided in the United States continuously since such entry, who is a person of good moral character, concerning whom there is no immigration record of permanent admission, and who is not subject to deportation. Form 659 for this purpose, together with instructions for its preparation, may be secured from any office of this Service.

The fee for a record of registry is \$10.
