

Second Witness: Mr Robert HUSTIN (decorator) 242 Ave BRUGMANS, BRUSSELS
being unable to speak English requires an Interpreter.

2nd dr L of C Provost Coy is sworn.

Witness having been duly sworn states:

"On I think SUNDAY, 17 DECEMBER 1944 at approximately 1100 PM
I was on the street in front of the Cafe Au BALLOON. I saw
the manager, Mr BERNARD and this soldier whom I recognize.
This soldier was waving a pistol around. I approached the
accused and twisted his arm until he dropped the pistol. He
had a knife in his belt which I removed for safety, although
he had not tried to use it. I gave the knife and pistol to
the Belgian Police. In my opinion the accused was drunk.

Accused declines to cross-examine this witness.

Knife and pistol not available for identification by the witness.

Third Witness: Mr RANSKIN, Officer of the Belgian Police, BRUSSELS.

In my opinion the attendance of the above witness at this
Summary of Evidence is impossible at the present time, but
he will be available to give evidence on a Court Martial.
