If for places within the Dominion.—A letter wholly unpaid is not forwarded, but is sent to the Dead-Letter Office, Ottawa. If prepaid at least one rate, that is, 3 cents, the letter is forwarded to destination, but is rated with double the deficient postage. This rule applies also to city or "drop" letters, the postage on which I cent per ½ ounce.
