## HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

ANY even numbered section of  
a Dominion Lands in Manitoba,  
Saskatchewan, and Alberta, ex-  
cepting 5 and 26, not reserved,  
may be homesteaded by any per-  
son who is the sole head of a  
family, or any male over 18 years  
of age, to the extent of one-  
quarter section of 160 acres, more  
or less.

Application for entry must be  
made in person by the applicant  
at a Dominion Lands Agency or  
Sub-agency for the district in  
which the land is situate.  
Entry by proxy may, however,  
be made at an Agency on certain  
conditions by the father, mother,  
son, daughter, brother or sister  
of an intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to  
perform the homestead duties un-  
der one of the following plans:—

(1) At least six months' resi-  
dence upon and cultivation of the  
land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so  
desires, perform the required re-  
sidence duties by living on farm-  
ing land owned solely by him,  
not less than eighty (80) acres in  
extent, in the vicinity of his  
homestead. Joint ownership in  
land will not meet this require-  
ment.

(3) If the father (or mother, if  
the father is deceased) of a  
homesteader has permanent re-  
sidence on farming land owned  
solely by him, not less than eighty  
(80) acres in extent, in the vicinity  
of the homestead, or upon a  
homestead entered for by him  
in the vicinity, such home-  
steader may perform his own  
residence duties by living with  
father (or mother).

(4) The term "vicinity" in the  
two preceding paragraphs is de-  
fined as meaning no more than  
nine miles in a direct line exclu-  
sive of the width of road allow-  
ances crossed in the measure-  
ment.

(5) A homesteader intending to  
perform his residence duties in  
accordance with the above while  
living with parents or on farming  
land owned by himself must notify  
the Agent for the district of his  
such intention.

Six months' notice in writing  
must be given to the Commis-  
sioner of Dominion Lands at Ot-  
tawa, of intention to apply for  
patent.
