## BUSINESS NOTES.

Robert Cole, planning mill, St. Thomas, Ont., has sold out to Blewett & Baldon.

W. J. Poupore, contractor, has just obtained judgment for \$29,508.93 in an action against the Lachine Rapids Hydraulic & Land Company of Montreal. The suit arose out of two contracts in 1899 and 1900 for the enlargement and improvement of the company's plant at Lachine. Mr. Poupore claimed \$86,463.93 for the balance due under the contract and for extra work rendered necessary during the progress of the contract. The company denied his claim, and by an incidental demand sought to recover a sum of \$46,100 claimed to have paid out for the completion of works which should have been carried out under the contract.
