A largely attended meeting of fruit growers was held at New Minas Hall on Tuesday evening. Messrs. Innes, DeWitt and Young presented the claims of the Apple Shipping Co. Much enthusiasm and interest were manifested by the audience. Speeches in favor of the scheme were made by Mr. Ansley Bishop, Mr. Sesman, Mr. Griffin, Mr. Roy, Mr. Eichenhour and others, all of whom advocated a change in the present mode of shipping and marketing apples, and spoke strongly in favor of the organization of a company to that end.

Thirteen meetings have been held in different sections of this and Annapolis counties. A meeting will be convened in Central Hall, Pictou, on Saturday, the 10th, at 2 p. m.
