Food Supplies at Aldershot.

The following from the Western Chronicle gives some idea of the enormous cost the country is put to carry along the militia camps in Canada...

Some idea of what is required to feed 3550 men in camp at Aldershot is afforded by the figures supplied by one in charge.

Of the above amounts there are used daily 12 barrels of flour, 600 lbs of bacon, 600 bushels of potatoes, 4000 lbs. of oats, 6000 lbs. of hay, 2000 lbs. of straw, 400 lbs. of beans, 300 lbs. of split peas, 3550 lbs. of beef...

For the twelve days' baking it will require 160 cords of wood.

Seventy-Eight Millions Increase.

Canada's commerce continues to show a remarkable growth. For the twelve months ending with the first of August the aggregate trade of Canada amounted to \$634,672,345, an increase of seventy-eight and a half millions over the corresponding period of the year previous.

The value of the imports was three hundred and sixty-five millions, a gain of sixty-nine millions. Exports were of the value of two hundred and sixty-nine million dollars, a gain of nine millions. Fifty-seven million dollars were collected in duty, an increase of ten millions.
