"Will you choose God or the World. Will you make the Forward Movement a memorial to the soldiers who died for you and a thanksgiving for peace, or will you refuse the greatest opportunity to carry on that has ever been given the people of this world?"

These were some of the questions asked by the Rev. Dr. Westgate, for three years an interned prisoner of war in German East Africa, who preached at St. Matthew's Church Sunday morning. He stated that for years the Germans instead of eradicating, planted thorns. Everyone knows what happened as a result and the people must remember this and not follow a bad example. Dr. Westgate spoke of the tremendous sufferings of the people of Africa under German rule and said that had the enemy won the war the lives of the British people would not have been worth living. German East Africa and part of Northern Africa are now in the possession of the British and it is up to the people of Great Britain and Canada to help them in every possible way. There are many people in the Northern parts of Canada who also need help. This is one of the great works that is being undertaken by the Forward Movement and one in which all can assist.
