

**Shop Reeve on Smoking and Dresses.**

Toronto, Jan. 15.—Bishop Reeve told an audience of 500 returned soldiers at the parish hall of St. Ann's Church last night that the men of Canada ought well to give up smoking as an example to the women of the country. "I have nothing to say against smoking," the bishop said, "but what is going to become of this country when the women are beginning to do as they are doing now, and when they dress as they are now doing? You will have to give up smoking because you don't want your women to have to give up smoking in self-defence to set an example to the women."

The majority of the men present were smoking at the time the bishop was addressing them. They listened to him in respectful silence.

**Russian Runs Amuck in Halifax.**

Halifax, Jan. 15.—I. Mittuk, a Russian residing at 492 Robie street, this city, and a former member of the 64th Battalion, ran amuck early this morning armed with a revolver, held a squad of police at bay until the trigger jammed and he was felled with a blow from a baton and taken to the police station. Bramley planned on being married to St. John, and then to take his bride to Centreville where he had prepared to receive her.

Receiving no further word from his bride, he communicated with the migration authorities, railways and police, but no trace of the missing girl has been discovered. Miss McIntosh was about twenty years of age, five feet six inches in height, and of robust build. She has dark hair, eyes, with a fair complexion, and is neatly freckled.
