I may say that Dr. Appleton and her assistant Miss Jackson, kindly undertook the work, under the auspices of the Young Wo-men's Christain Association, while Sister Bailey, who has been at Forteau for some thirteen years, was on vaca tion in England. Forteau, Labrador. July 1, 1920.

Hon. Robert Watson. Managing Director, International Grenfell Association,

experienced social worker and I, arrived at Forteau, October 18th, 1919. We closed the hospital to patients yesterday, June 30th, 1920. During the eight months and thirteen days that have been here I have treated 616 out-patients and 11 in-patients, making 1189 visits for out-patients and 159 days of hospital care for in-patients totaling 1348 visits on days of hospital treatment. From out-patients I have collected \$211.72, and from in-patients \$36.50, making a total of \$248.22 col-

Besides the usual medical service, my assistant and I have conducted a health and hygiene campaign in accordance with the program of the Social Morality Committee and Bureau of Social Education of the Young Women's Christain Association under which we are working. We have conducted recreation work for young peo-ple, developed play ground activities for children and installed play ground appartus at Forteau as the gift of the Young Women's Christian Association. In view of the shocking high mortality at child-birth and the resulting at-titude of both men and women toward a normal function, we have tried to
