Prosand many reports were spread long that the ship was a total loss. was not until noon hour. however. then a wireless was received, conveying the glad tidings that the steamer been refloated at 6 a.m., and was occeeding under her own steam to alleyfield, which is about three miles om where the ship struck. The respero's crew evidently did good work during Saturday night as a large part of the cargo had to be jettisoned order to lighten the ship, which must have been kept up unceasingly during the night. There was quite iteling of relief, when it was made hown that the ship had been refloat-She is, however, badly damaged, the fore-peak and the forward holds m full of water. The engine room. o. 3 hold, and the stoke hold, as reted by the captain, are free. As m as word had been received that the ship had made Valleyfield the Watchful, which was made ready to mil, was held back, and will be sent West on the Portia's route, the latter teamer taking up the service as carfled on by the Prospero. When the hip left here she was filled to capacty, having carried a heavy deck load, Most of the cargo consisted of provisions for ports north of Capes Toho, and if this had been lost it would have been a serious matter, especialat this season.
