AT A GRATE FIRE.

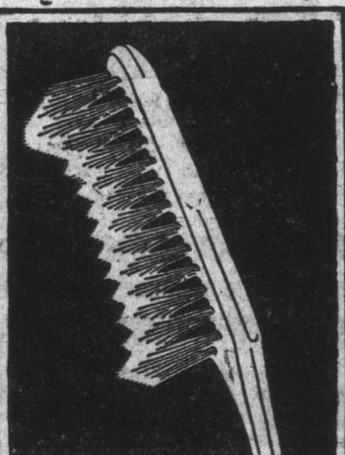
