The resolution was carried. Mr. Massey, in moving a vote of thanks to the Chairman, said that their opponents were concentrating all their forces on the North Riding, and he asked them to give hearty aid to their friends in the North Riding in electing Col. Higginbotham.

Mr. Jas. Limes seconded the motion. He also referred to the necessity of working for the candidates in the other Ridings.

The chairman having returned thanks in suitable terms, three cheers were given for the Queen, three for Mr. Sturton, three for Mr. Gow, three for the Government, and the meeting terminated.
