Co-operative Township Fair. At a meeting of the Western Fair Board held on Saturday the scheme of holding a big co-operative fair in this city was discussed. The plan submitted originated with Mr. D. McKenzle. If the objections that present themselves can be overcome, it is proposed that instead of the several townships and large towns holding individual shows, with the small premium accompaniment, that a monater two days' show be held in this city. There are several important considerations which commend the idea to practical men. The success of the innumerable small shows has yearly been on the wane, and with many of them it is but a question of a year or two when they will be compelled, on account of unsatifactory finances, to quit doing business altogether. By the scheme proposed the existing rivalry would receive the best of stimulus, as it would be easier to pay a premium of \$10 with the increased gate receipts than it would be to pay the former premiums of \$1 and \$2. The proposition is that the combined fairs be billed two days before the great Western Fair, so that the entries may be on the grounds and thus avoid reshipment. The four townships will be approached first, and if they can be induced to cast in their respective lots, overtures will be made to the fair boards of St. Thomas, St. Marys, Strathroy and other places.
