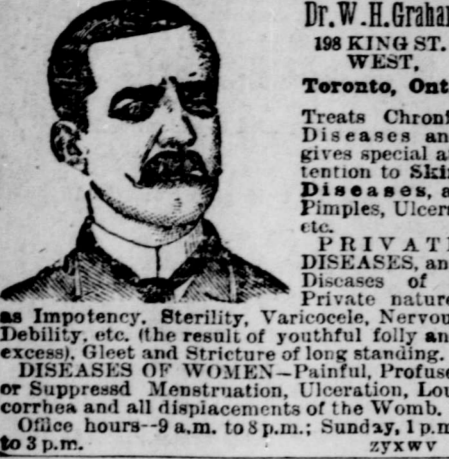

On Sept. 22, 1895, John H. Murray suddenly left his wife and family in this city, and they have received no word from him since. Recently Mrs. Murray published in a Detroit paper a description of her husband's appearance, and yesterday received word that the body of a drowned man answering to it had been found at Sand Beach on Saturday last. Murray is 35 years old, of fair complexion, blue eyes, a heavy mustache, rather stout, and 5 feet 9 inches in height. On his right arm is tattooed his initials, "J. H. M." It has not yet been learned if the body is that of Murray. Mrs. Murray is now living at 14 Dundas street, where a reporter found her first had a good position in the G. T. R. shops in Stratford, but died some years ago. By him she has one child, a daughter. About six years ago she married Murray in London, and shortly afterwards they went to Grand Rapids. After remaining there a year they returned to London. Mrs. Murray says she was greatly disappointed in her husband. He was shiftless and afraid of work. She had been left some means by her first husband, and Murray took advantage of this. He was more a burden than a support to her. They were living in the East End last year when he left her. A friend in Port Huron informed her that Murray had shipped as a sailor on a lake boat, but his wife has heard nothing from him in all this time. She has written to different points for information.

PRESBYTERY OF LONDON. Statistical Report—Membership of the Congregations and Sunday Schools Increased—List of the Average Contributions Per Family by the Various Churches.

The annual statistical and financial report of the Presbytery of London for last year shows a considerable increase in membership of the congregations over the preceding year. There are 50 congregations in the Presbytery. The pastoral charges number 33, of which 8 receive assistance from the augmentation fund.

There are 75 more families than in the preceding year, the total number being 3,365. The number of single persons not connected with families of the several congregations is 680, an increase of 46. The number of communicants is 7,028, which is 146 increase. During the year 862 communicants were received, of which 543 were on profession of faith and 319 by certificate. The dismissions by death were 101, by certificate 208, without certificate 164, and by admission 7. The number of infants baptised, 28, and adults 116. There are 34 ministers, 270 elders, and 403 other office-bearers on the Presbytery roll.

terloo Street—supported jointly by the First Presbyterian and Knox Churches. Every congregation in the Presbytery contributed to foreign missions except Bryanston, English Settlement, Tempo and North Delaware. Every home mission was neglected by only two congregations—Bryanston and Ilderton. Although no congregation has given as largely to missions in 1895 as one did in 1894, yet none have fallen so low as some did a year ago. Not only is the amount larger this year than last, but the burden has been more equally shared than hitherto.
