Noted American Singer Conquers His Audience In Great Musical Treat

Reinald Werrenrath Renders Brilliant Recital At Grand Theatre.

VARIETY OF SONGS

Possesses Powerful Appearance and Sings With Unlimited Range.

Reinald Werrenrath sings like a big man should. At least that is what London thinks after hearing him at the Grand on Thursday night. He did not storm the citadel all at once. He came on gradually and there were no false steps. In folk songs, ballads and traditions he commenced his conquest. In songs of Danish tongue he moved on farther. He sang of pirates at sea, of old sea captains and their dreams. He made the eye grow misty as he gave new vision to the little streams of Duna, and if there is such a thing as a musical anti-climax, Werrenrath reached it when he sang Walter Damrosch's setting of Kipling's "They're Hanging Danny Dever in the Morning." It was more than a song. The sergeant on parade appeared, his dialect tragic and true to his hand, bit off words and told the story of a traitor.

Powerful Appearance. Reinald Werrenrath is all equipped to sing. He has all things in his favor. He is big, powerful in appearance. He has a mannerism that is all his own, one that gives the impression that he is master of the situation. When he concludes a telling passage he stands as though to defy interruption or to challenge anyone to move.

A wonderful baritone, unlimited range, powerful or plaintive, the voice does just what he wants it to do. If he wants more power, it is there; if he wants to sing a lullaby he can use just enough of it. Enunciation is taken for granted. Werrenrath sings words, and the people can understand them. He leaves nothing to be taken for granted.

When he turns to "Roy's Wife of Aldvalloch" he is tragic and indignant as he sings of a faithless wife, when he turns to "Trade Winds" he surprises his hearers by showing that a musical picture of an old Spanish sailor can be sung with the pathos of a lullaby.

Songs Not Repeated.

Nor does Werrenrath repeat his songs. His logic on this point is convincing and unique. "I never repeat a song," he told his audience after a storm of applause marked the close of "Duna." "The reason is this, I would either sing it better or worse the second time, in which case one or the other would suffer." So he compromises and sings something else.

He is considerate of his audience. When he uses Danish songs he tells the people what it's all about. So when he explained that he would sing of a trumpeter who awakened the bride of royalty, who had been his sweetheart of old, it was easy to follow, for the Danish school of composers is, above all else, interpretative to a degree.

Great Variety. What a variety. Werrenrath chooses well, and he never loses his hearers. He pictures "The Lone Dog," bad, wicked, fierce; he sings "Slow Horses, Slow," and the horses go slow. He turns to that rollicking old song, "On the Road to Mandalay," and with a smile he swings into the refrain, and the performance is over. The program says so, but the people have moved. They are thundering applause, and he sings again and again. Werrenrath has conquered.

Accompanist Is Good.

Herbert Carriek is an accompanist in every sense of the word. Sympathetic, responding to every mood of the singer, he was left nothing to be desired. Mr. Carriek performed a real service for musical London when he brought Reinald Werrenrath to this city.

Winter Garden Orchestra Attains Distinction

There is an old saying about an artist never exchanging recognition in his own home town, but this does not seem to hold true with regard to Dan Macaulay and his Winter Garden orchestra of this city, as they are regarded by all as the finest exponents of modern dance music in Western Ontario. However, we notice now a new honor has been bestowed upon them, as a well-known New York music publisher is featuring a picture of their orchestra on the title page of a new waltz publication. This is an honor seldom attained by a Canadian orchestra and we wish Dan and his orchestra every success. Adv. b
