Wheat has made no movement yet, and the millers have barely sufficient supply for the local demand.

Several loads of new peas came forward, and the samples were poor, showing that the bug (bruchus pisa) has worked considerable destruction to this crop.

There was a scarcity of lamb, and 10c a pound wholesale was the ruling price. The truth is, lambs are dearer in this market than in Buffalo, and the question may be pointedly asked, what advantage would reciprocity be us in this line of agricultural products?

THE STATE OF TRADE.

Bradstreet's Weekly Review of the Situation. New York, August 29.—(Special)—Special telegrams to Bradstreet's report all the evidences of increasing commercial and industrial activity noted last week.

There is no advance in the price of iron yet, but an astonishing feature is found in the ease with which the enormous total output of the furnaces is absorbed.

What has reacted 3c from the high price touched early in the week, and corn and oats have been in natural sympathy with the decline. This is due to foreign markets refusing to follow further at this time the advance in domestic markets, together with some slight improvement in crop reports.

The total export of wheat (and flour as well) both consists of the week ending August 26, 2,562,322 bushels, against 3,089,985 bushels in the like week a year ago, and 3,489,985 bushels last week.

Dry goods jobbers are actively engaged, and agents are doing a good re-order business in fall and winter goods. As a consequence cotton and wool dress goods are in brief movement. Foreign goods show more life, but are still behind the average in demand.

Cotton is 1/2c to 3/4c off in all markets on continued liquidation of the old crop, heavy new crop movement and good advice from producing sections. New crop deliveries are well held.

Business failures reported number 134 in the United States for the week ending August 26th, against 173 the week last year. Canada had 36 this week, against 20 last week. The total number of failures in the United States from January 1 to date is 6,797, against 7,603 in a like portion of 1889.
