The Sun admits that all this land has been taken up, but says that "the truth is that nearly all the land which our contemporary suppose to be 'locked up' is offered to settlers at merely nominal prices and on the easiest terms."

When you deduct all these vested and already appropriated lands and then make allowances for the bad lands, the bogs, the low lands, the barren lands, the sand hills, and alkaline plains and the like, the amount of unappropriated good land anywhere near the railway is not so very large.
