The company desired the addition of the following clause:

The provisions of sec. 7 of I this agreement as to ten days' previous notice shall not apply to casos where it becomes necessary for the continuance of the company's traffic from the sinking or spreading of the tracks or ties of the company, or from any other like cause temporarily affecting small portions of the company's tracks (not exceeding in any case fifty feet in length) that the same should be immediately repaired, and in such cases the company may eause such necessary repairs thereto to be made at its own expense without the notice aforesaid; but the City Engineer, if he considers the case not to be within the provision of this section, may require the provisions of sections 7 and 8 to be compiled with by the company and in such case the company shall not proceed therewith.


