Provincial Secretary McLellan Defeated

The Opposition Make a Clean Sweep

Only 25 of the 41 seats were contested.

The Opposition have been successful in 18 of these, and the Government in 7.

Fourteen Government members were returned by acclamation last Monday and two other constituencies returning two members each.

The Opposition only nominated one candidate, thus ensuring the election of one Ministerialist.

Of the five members of the Executive Council who went to the polls, one was defeated, Provincial Secretary McLellan, who was re-elected by acclamation.
