Paris, Oct. 16.—One of those terrible erimes which periodically besmirch the reputation of Paris has been perpetrated in the Rue Bouchardon, a working class district near the Porte St. Martin Theatre. Madame Dally, a young woman, the wife of a foreman printer, was found foully and brutally murdered in her residence. The discovery was made by the husband on returning home from work about 8 o'clock in the evening. Blood was besprinkled all over the little place. The baby and its cradle were almost deluged with it. Madame Dally's face was disfigured nearly beyond recognition by gaping wounds. Her forehead was cut open and her right eye was destroyed, evidently from a blow inflicted with a heavy bronze candlestick, which was on the floor covered with blood, bits of flesh and tufts of hair.

The printer was examined and could not give any clue. He said that he had no enemies that he knew of and his wife was of irreproachable character, assisting him materially by her earnings as a cravat-maker in keeping up their little establishment. He also stated that about £5 or £10 in notes and gold had been taken from the juge d'instruction as first believed that the course of a struggle with her resolved to make away with the woman in order to save himself from falling into the hands of the law. This theory, however, has been replaced by another, to the effect that the crime was due to revenge. The evident fury of the murderer and the savage throughness of his terrible work point to the theory of revenge, and it is even said that a woman may have committed the deed. The whole case is therefore enveloped in the deepst mystery.




