CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

Consumers are not delaying the purchasing of lumber in the hope of lower prices, as up to the present time there have been no indications of weakness and nothing to encourage such belief. The buying all season has been steady and of considerable volume, with only a slight falling off in the mid-ammer period. Everywhere umbermen are wearing a look of satisfaction, apparently believing that the pr sperity of the business will continue f., some time yet. Stocks in the yards are in excellent position to sustain prices. In the Georgian Bay district there are only one or two large blocks of lumber on the market, and these would probably have been bought up before this but for extraordinary circumstances. Negotiations for one of these blocks are now under way. Inquiries are constantly being cac, yed by manufacturers and dealers for the better grades of pine, of which the supply is short. Unusually high prices are being offered. Hardwoods have not changed, being still in good demand at firm prices. Greater competition among buyers indicates a growing appreciation of the shortage in hardwood stocks which promises to be experienced in the near future. There is a little irregularity in prices quoted by Toronto dealers, those having none of last year's production being obliged in some instances to advance their prices in order to secure a margin of profit.

QUEBEC AND THE MARITIME PROVINCES.

Spruce lumber becomes more easily marketed as the season advances. Stocks have not accumulated at the mills, but have been bought up for export almost as quickly as they have been manufactured. The prevailing low freight rates have enabled shippers to compete very successfully in foreign markets, even in the face of the high first cost. The buying by United States concerns has been felt quite keenly by dealers this year, and has, of course, been the means of enabling the mill man to realize more for his lumber. Wide deals are scarce, the supply of all sizes above 5 inches being below the average of other years. Cedar products are firm, slungles ranging from \$3.50 to \$3.60 for extras on Boston rate of freight.

UNITED STATES.

The lumber market has had the benefit of fine weather during the past week. This has been reflected in increased trade and a general disposition to stock up. The white pine situation is most satis-
