

Non-rotational employees in BKA who are working exclusively on the international sports program will receive an offer of employment at their same substantive group and level from Fitness and Amateur Sport. They will also be eligible for cash-outs since they will be covered under the provisions of the Workforce Adjustment policy.

11. To what extent will EAITC continue to be involved in the international sports program?

The Department will provide to Fitness and Amateur Sport foreign policy guidance as required. Canadian missions will of course continue to provide assistance for international sports activities.

International Expositions

12. What is the effective date of this program transfer?

April 1, 1992. The date for the physical move of this program (BKE) is expected to be November, 1992 i.e. after the conclusion of the Seville Exposition. As of April 1, BCB will report direct to DOC on this program.

13. I am a non-rotational employee in BKE. What happens to me?

You will receive an offer of employment from the Department of Communications at your same substantive group and level. You will also be eligible for a cash-out since you will be covered under the provisions of the workforce adjustment policy. (see separate questions and answers on WFA).

14. I am a rotational FS working in BKE. What happens to me?

You remain an employee of EAITC and will remain in your current position. There is the possibility that after the physical move to DOC, rotational employees dedicated to this program could be seconded to DOC to facilitate continuity and near term program delivery.
