enacted by parliament and that section provides that the governor in council may commute a sentence of death to imprisonment in a penitentiary for life or for any term of years not less than two years, or to imprisonment in a prison other than a penitentiary for a period of less than two years.

I should like to point out also that section 642A was enacted by parliament, and it should be noted that section of the Criminal Code provides that when the jury finds an

accused guilty of capital murder the judge shall ask the jury whether they wish to make any recommendation in regard to clemency. In both the cases referred to by the hon. member, the cases of Frederick Myron Turner and Michael Gregory Kuzyk, there were unanimous recommendations from the jury concurred in by the trial judge.
