ABILITY OF MANPOWER COUNSELLORS TO ASSIST UNEMPLOYED

Question No. 23-Mr. Marshall:

Did the Minister of Manpower and Immigration state that a lot of people really don't know what to expect from the various government agencies and, if so, does he consider Manpower counsellors capable of assisting the unemployed?

Mr. Ray Perrault (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Manpower and Immigration): The Minister does not recall making the exact statement as it appears in the first part of the question but he has stated that many people are frequently unaware of the services available from the various government departments and agencies. With regard to the second part of the question he does consider manpower counsellors capable of assisting the unemployed through the various manpower programs and services provided through Canada Manpower Centres, including occupational and labour market counselling, referral to employment, occupational training and allowances, referral for vocational rehabilitation and geographical mobility assistance.
