then to carry out the obligation I undertook according to the plan to publish the letter, ~~as~~ approved in Sir Arthur's letter to me of October 10. Incidentally, I believe that Close's letter, though he probably had no such intention, pays a tribute to the loyalty of McGill's staff that, in all the circumstances that exist, is of very considerable value.

On Monday night, when I gave a radio speech on "McGill as a Source of News," I added a paragraph that did not appear in the copies provided to the press. I am enclosing a copy of this additional paragraph, in which I expressed, though feebly, the distress that the news of Sir Arthur's illness has caused to all those in any way associated with him in his work at McGill.
