then to carry out the obligation I undertook  
to publish the letter, <sup>according to the plan</sup> approved in Sir Arthur's  
letter to me of October 10. Incidentally, I believe  
that Close's letter, though he probably had no  
such intention, pays a tribute to the loyalty  
of M<sup>c</sup>Gill's staff that, in all the circumstances  
that exist, is of very considerable value.

On Monday night, when I gave a  
radio speech on "M<sup>c</sup>Gill as a Source of News",  
I added a paragraph that did not appear  
in the copies provided to the press. I am  
enclosing a copy of this additional paragraph,  
in which I expressed, though feebly, the  
distress that the news of Sir Arthur's illness  
has caused to all those in any way  
associated with him in his work at M<sup>c</sup>Gill.
