Dear Dr. Douglas,

As you know from my last letter, I am in attendance at the University of California upon your advice as contained in your letter to Governor Phillips. I still consider McGill the University of my choice, but in looking over the requirements for entrance into the Faculty of Medicine at your school, I noticed that a full year's course in Organic Chemistry including lectures and laboratory is required. The only course in organic chemistry available to me in this, my third year, is a one Semester course. Credit given for this course by the University of California is three units for lecture, and three units for laboratory. I was wondering if you would accept my credit for organic chemistry as a year's course since I am told that the material covered here in the semester courses in both lecture and laboratory is equivalent to a year's course in other institutions. I am very anxious to find out about this because, due to the influence of friends who are graduates of the McGill Faculty of Medicine, I am convinced that it is the school for me.

I was very sorry to have missed you when I heard that you were visiting in Bisbee.
