UNION OPPONENTS ISSUE PAMPHLET

Presbyterian Minority Gives Reasons Why Church Unity is Not Practicable.

Vigorous declarations against organic union are contained in a pamphlet issued by "the joint committee" representing the minority of the Presbyterian General Assembly on the union issue.

The case against union is first presented from the historical standpoint. A resolution of the assembly of 1905 is quoted to the effect that "a union is not to be entered into without the consent of the entire membership."

The statistical argument gives 115,968 communicants as voting for union and 51,891 against, with 135,400 not voting.

Nice Adjustment Best. The argument is advanced that union is not required to prevent waste of means or energy in small or diminishing populations as a nice adjustment between the churches will accomplish the desired end.

The majority vote of the general assembly in 1905 is declared to be a declaration of organic union is declared to have "made necessary the resolve to organize for the continuance of our church."

Seven Reasons. Seven reasons are elaborated for "the discontinuance of the present agitation." Summarized the seven arguments against the organic union of the Presbyterian denominations with the Methodists and Congregationalists are claimed to be:

1. The Presbyterian church is the oldest type of Christian organization in the world, that of the Church of the New Testament, and patterned after the Church of God in the Old Testament.

2. Christian unity does not demand uniformity of name and organization.

3. There is no warrant in scripture for making organic unity an obligation of the Church of Christ on earth.

4. The proposed change would mean less effective work.

5. Historically the lands where one church has existed have steadily increasing spiritual deadness.

6. The proposed basis is seriously defective and ambiguous in doctrinal teaching.

7. The vote of the three churches shows that none of them is prepared for union.

NEARLY TWO HUNDRED ALIENS DEPORTED
