At the meeting of the committee on works yesterday the matter of the reconstruction of the Strachan avenue oridges over the railroad tracks was referred back for a further report showing the probable amount of dam-ages the city would have to pay for putting large factories upon a twenty foot lane instead of a road of standard

The John Inglis Company asked that the new bridges be deviated eastward twenty feet so as to give a forty foot road for the factory instead of the twenty foot lane the proposed bridge allows. Commissioner Harris contended that the bridges have already been deviated twenty feet, and he would not stand for another twenty feet. The committee them decided to The committee then decided to have a report showing the cost for damages and why the bridges should not be deviated to allow a wider roadway on the level.
