R E M A R K S .

23rd, 24th, 25th, 26th, 27th. Rain 13th, 14th, 17th. Falls of snow very frequent; in one week, during which it snowed every day, the aggregate quantity was 24.6 inches. Sky quite overcast except on a very few days, and only on one occasion, viz.: during the 48 hours from 9 P.M. on 6th, to 9 P.M., 8th, was the temperature below zero. No gales and only two or three times a brisk wind. It would appear that the snow has fallen to a considerably greater depth in the country than in the

town. In the backwoods the depth of the snow, according to report, is from four to five feet.

CORNWALL. — Wind storm on 23rd. Snow 3rd, 4th, 10th, 11th, 13th, 15th, 16th, 17th, 18th, 19th 20th, 23rd, 24th, 25th, 26th, 27th.

GOBERICH. — On 12th, very rapid thaw. 15th, storm of rain, freezing as it fell, leaving a coating of ice three-quarters of an inch thick; the ice moved out from the shore and broke up; at 7 A.M. dry and wet

BARRIE. — On 10th, dense fog. 14th, 19th, 23rd, 27th, very heavy storms of snow and wind. 18th, large lunar halo. 24th, very sudden and violent storm of wind and snow arose at 3 P.M., lasting about half an hour. Wind storms, 4th, 14th, 19th, 23rd, 24th, 27th. Snow 2nd, 4th, 10th, 14th, 15th, 16th, 18th, 19th, 20th, 21st, 22nd, 23rd, 24th, 26th, 27th. Rain 13th, 14th, 15th, 18th.

BEAUVILLE. — Snow 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 8th, 9th, 15th, 18th, 21st, 22nd.
