he shall not enter the kingdom of God; but, "Except a man be born again, he cannot SEE," that is, comprehend, "the kingdom of God."

You will therefore see the absolute necessity of your obtaining this new birth. Whatever its meaning—whatever event it points to—its vital importance is awfully evident. Our Lord says: "Without it no man can even SEE the kingdom of God."

Fourthly: Our Lord's words teach us that the birth He refers to is a HEAVENLY birth.

ABOVE. Now, we have all had one birth from beneath, that is, our natural physical birth, when we came into the world; but Christ says this first physical birth is not enough; we need another—one from above. When therefore we have this birth from above, we are, in our Lord's language, born of the Spirit; we have experienced this wondrous birth without which no man can see the kingdom of God. I would have you also notice that the two births, the physical and the spiritual, never occur TOGETHER. Man was altogether "born in sins," with a "heart deceitful above all
