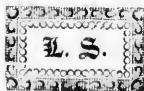


or Justices of the Peace, who shall render such judgment of conviction, may reduce the amount of the penalty to Twenty Dollars currency, in all cases where the offence committed has no reference to a sea-going vessel, or to cargo carried or to be carried in a sea-going vessel, or is not committed by the Master or person in charge of a sea-going vessel.

Article 83.—The By-laws numbered 21, 46, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58 and 59, forming part of the By-laws made and passed by the said Harbour Commissioners of Montreal, on the 21st day of April, 1859; and all such portions of By-laws numbers 39 and 40, and of any other of the said By-laws as are inconsistent with the foregoing By-laws, are hereby revoked and repealed.

I hereby certify, that the foregoing Amendments to the By-Laws of the Harbour Commissioners of Montreal, numbered from 63 to 83 inclusive, are true copies of said Amendments, duly made and passed at a Meeting of the said Corporation, held at Montreal, on the 11th day of July, 1861, and sanctioned and confirmed by His Excellency Sir Edmund Walker Head, Governor General of British North America, &c., &c., &c., on the 12th day of September, 1861, and published in "The *Canada Gazette*, published by authority," on the 28th day of September, 1861.
