ber, with that of his proposer, will be entered in a book provided for that purpose, on the day of his admission; but the period for which the privileges of the Club may be granted him will be reckoned from his first entry to the Club House to partake of them. If, however, any honorary member shall fail to avail himself of the permission within the fourteen days, it will then be cancelled. No person shall be eligible to be proposed as an honorary member after having been in Halifax fourteen days, nor for more than once in any one year.

Committee of Management.

XVII.—The general concerns of the Club shall be managed by a Committee of fifteen members, in addition to the present Trustees, who shall be members ex officio. The Committee shall be elected by ballot, of whom one-third shall go out annually by rotation, the vacancies to be filled up at the General Meeting; but the five retiring members may be re-elected. Whenever there are three vacancies in the Committee in the current year, notice shall be posted in the Club, and such vacancies shall be filled up by ballot on the day for the election of members next after fourteen days from such notice. A Treasurer shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting, who shall be ex officio a member of the Commit-The Treasurer elect will be required before
