Diagonal Roads.

Plans for two diagonal roads, both at a width of 110 feet, were submitted by the assessment department and approved of by the committee. One starts at the bridge in Moore Park and runs diagonaly to Sullivan's Corners in practically a straight line, except for two necessary jogs. The other commences at the corner of Eglinton-ave, and Forest Hill-road and runs to a point where it would meet Lansing side-line extended westerly. At the next meeting of the Ontario Railway Board these plans will be submitted for the purpose of having all future subdivisions conform to the roads.
