New York, April 7.—Fresh from his triumph in the recent municipal election, Mayor-elect Edward P. Duane of Chicago came to New York to-night and addressed a large meeting in Cooper Union, under the auspices of the Municipal Ownership League of this city. He told his hearers how he expected to carry out his pledges made in his recent campaign in Chicago to attain municipal ownership of the city.

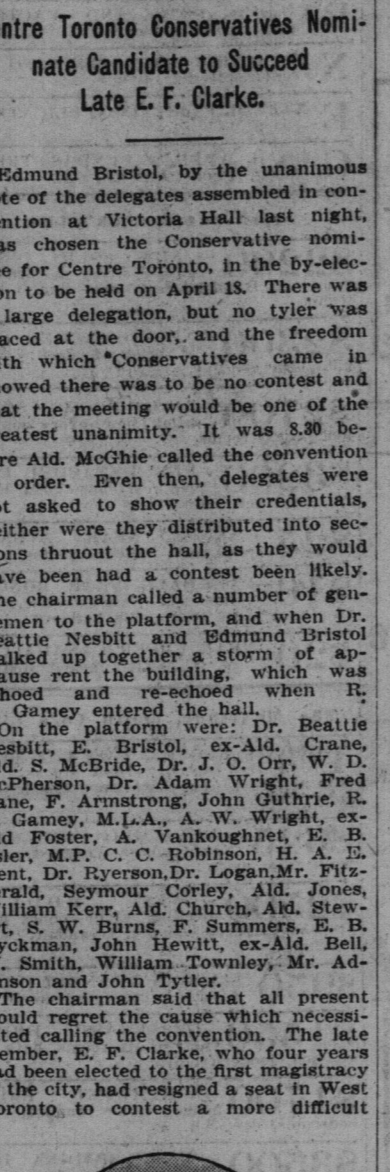

27 WARSHIPS SIGHTED
SOUTHWEST OF PENANG
Interest Travels Back Again to Naval Movements—Japs to Ambuscade?

London, April 7.—A despatch from Singapore to The Daily Express says that the Japanese navy is reported to have sighted 27 warships 200 miles southeast of Penang. A Batavia (Java) despatch to the same paper says that Chinese junk reports that Japanese warships are patrolling all the straits available to the Russian second Pacific squadron in the China seas.

London, April 7.—The commission of experts appointed to investigate the recent wholesale collapse of brick built buildings in London, has reported to-day that an examination was made of eight buildings, and in every case the collapse, or partial destruction, was due to the failure of their foundations. The report states that the foundations were found to be full of voids, built of irregular and undressed stones, and in many cases the foundations were found to be made of inferior quality and improperly mixed.

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500 Gurkhas Killed in Collapse of Stone Barracks, and Whole Valley, with Two Towns, Reported Devastated

Calcutta, April 7.—It now appears that 400 members of the 7th Gurkhas were killed at the Dharmala cantonment by the collapse of a stone barracks building in consequence of the recent earthquake. In addition twenty members of the second battalion of the 1st Gurkhas were killed, while it is roughly calculated that from twenty to thirty per cent of the native population of the surrounding villages were killed. In addition to the Europeans already reported killed at Dharmala, seven children were reported to have perished.

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MINISTER'S EVIL DOUBLE UNLAWFULLY USES NAME
Yonge St. Merchants Get Orders From Fakir Resaume

Hon. Dr. Resaume, minister of public works for Ontario, has a double, and the doctor is becoming nervous, as the actions of his other self lead him to expect trouble at any time. Visions of military bills for summer hats and private telegrams received here says the whole Town of Palampur has been leveled to the ground, and that not a single building is left standing. This announcement has not been confirmed up to the present. Palampur is a town of the Punjab and has about 5000 inhabitants. It is situated in the Kangra district and is the site of the plantations of the Falam Valley.

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DEATH OF QZAR, ASSASSIN
DEMONSTRATION AT FUNERAL

St. Petersburg, April 7.—The workmen of Sankovsk made a demonstration today, the occasion being the burial of an employee of the Hall factory, who was killed by policemen a few days ago. Six thousand persons assembled early in the morning in a heavy snowstorm and awaited the funeral procession. There were red flags everywhere, and a wreath deposited by socialists on the coffin was inscribed "Died an innocent victim in the struggle for victory."

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TAX ON RAILWAYS 3 PER CENT.

Should Contribute to the Province on Basis of Gross Earnings, So Report Recommends.

The above are the recommendations of the railway taxation commission appointed by the Ross government last year to gather information, and present a report on the best means to be adopted to secure more revenue by means of taxing the railway corporations. The commission, composed of H. J. Fettyer, Prof. Adam Shortt and Judge Bell, visited several provinces of the union and the result of its investigations is contained in the report which fills several hundred pages of typewritten foolscap. After giving a review of the various methods of taxation in Ontario, and the assessment laws of the states visited, the report concludes as follows:

That the railways should be adequately taxed, every one including themselves, will admit, but there is apt to be an exaggerated idea of the ability of railways to pay taxes. Province must have more revenue. The commission recommends a tax of 3 per cent, on the gross receipts of railways. Freight tax: 2 1/2 a mile on length and 1 1/2 a mile on shorter lines. The commission recommends the appointment of a provincial board of taxation with power to tax on real estate, and to gather statistics. The commission recommends that telegraph, express and sleeping car companies be taxed on gross receipts, according to their ability to pay.
