Local Demand Active With Prices Higher

Receipts of Grain on Street Much Larger Yesterday—Provisions are Lower in London.

Wednesday Evening, Nov. 24. Lard is 3d lower and bacon 6d to 1s lower in Liverpool.

Cash wheat in Chicago 1/2c higher at 95 1/2c. Liverpool wheat futures are 1/4 to 1/2d higher.

Receipts of hogs at Chicago to-day 42,000; official Tuesday 40,300; left over 3500; estimated for Thursday 30,000.

Receipts of wheat at Minneapolis and Duluth to-day 702 cars.

Exports at New York to-day: Flour 29 1/2 barrels and 10388 sacks; wheat 205,531 bushels.

The aggregate stocks of wheat at Odessa, Rostoff, Budapest and Berdiansk on Nov. 1 were 11,240,000 bushels, against 26,640,000 bushels one year ago.

FLOUR—The market is firmer, with good enquiry. Straight rollers are quoted at \$4 to \$4.10 middle freight, Manitoba patents at \$3.20 to \$3.25 middle freight, at \$3.
