Visible and Afloat.

There are now on passage to the United Kingdom 12.160,000 bushels of wheat and flour and 4.480,000 bushels of corn. There are on passage to the European Continent 11.680,000 bushels of corn. Thus, the total quantities of cereals affoat to-day, with comparative figures for a week ago, are:

Through freight rates from Chicago to Liverpool declined about 2½c per bushel during last week. Lake freights are reported, Chicago to Buffaio, 2½c for wheat, 2½c for corn, and to Montreal, 6e for corn. The through rate on wheat, Chicago to Liverpool, 17%c per bushel. Flour and the Visible.

The World a few days ago ventured the opinion that the small increase in the visible supply of wheat in the United States was due to the fact of the immense business of the flour mills this season, which has attracted to the mills millions of business of wheat which would otherwise have gone to the elevators at the primary Westera markets. Bradstreet's reports that the Minneapolis nills last week broke all records of weekly production, and that the sales have been in excess of the production. The Chicago Dally Bulletin reports the weekly output of the four leading milling points in the West 616,150 barrels flour, as compared with 478,806 barrels in corresponding week last year. The weekly production of flour in all the United States is about 1,700,000 barrels. If there has been anything like the same proportionate increase at other milling points as at the above four, it is not surprising that an immense quantity of wheat has disappeared from visible supply.

Liverpool wheat futures were easy to-day, closing 1d to 1¼d lower than on Saturday. Paris wheat closed 10 centimes higher to 20 centimes lower than on Saturday. With flour 5 centimes lower to 10 centimes higher.

These weaker cables, together with heavy Northwese receipts and the large quantity affoat, caused a heavy feeling during the far the small increase in the visible and the decreased Russian and Danubian silpments brought about an upturn. The manager of the North Dakota Millers' Association says fully one-third of the wheat crop in that state is 61 shock or stack, and half of that in shock has been seriously damaged or rulped. It is reported that 60 per cent, of the wheat along the line of the Northern Pacific has been damaged more or less.

The premium for cash wheat over future deliveries has disappeared in France, the quotation in Paris for quarter of 480 lbs. being uniform at 38s 1½d for all months up to April next.

The closing price for December wheat in Chicago last Monday was 70%c; on Saturday, Oct. 29, 66½c, showing a decline of 4½c during the week.

The receipts of wheat and flour at the Western primary markets during last week were 0,341,548 busnels wheat, and 232,987 barrels flour, as compared with 7,088,220 busnels wheat and 150,640 barrels flour in corresponding week of last year. This is a remarkable showing, succeeding, as it does, some weeks of like increase. And yet Bradstreet's reports that the condition of the roads has in many localities prevented the free marketing of wheat, and that there is a disposition on the part of many farmers to hold back their wheat for higher prices.
