AURORA CEMETERY A MECCA. Strange Lifelike Etchings on a

Tombstone Bring Hundreds of Curious Visitors. Queen Mary said before her death that the word "Calais" would be found engravsed on her heart, so keenly had she taken the loss of the French city. 


