

QUEBEC, Feb. 16.—As a result of the municipal elections, which were held here today, Quebec has a new mayor in Joseph Samson, a wholesale and retall hardware merchant, and a large real estate owner, who defeated Mayor Lavigueur by a majority of 1,033 votes. The total number of votes polled was 9.651, which is only about 50 per cent of the names on the voters' lists. BRITISH CONSIDER TAX ON WAR-TIME WEALTH INCREASES

LONDON, Feb. 16 .- In the House of of Commons this evening on the House of Commons this evening on the Government's motion for the appointment of a committee to inquire into the practicability of a tax on war-time increases in wealth, Sir Donald McLean, Liberal, moved an amendment in favor Liberal, moved an amendment in favor of extending the inquiry to the practicability of a capital levy to reduce the national debt.

J. Austen Chamberlain, chancellor of the exchequer, opposed the amendment on the ground that the prospect of such a levy would encourage extravagant spending, chack enterprise and discourage saving. He said he believed Great Britain would be able to meet her liabilities without resorting to danger-liabilities without resorting to danger-louing or rash experiments.

Under Five Sovereigns

KINGSTON, Feb. 16.—Mrs. Fraser, who died today at the age of 94. lived under five British sovereigns, she having been born in the reign of King George IV. She was a spectator of the inauguration of the first parliament of United Canada, which took place in the building now occupied as a general hospital for Kingston. A few months later she witnessed the state funeral of Lord Sydenham, who was laid to rest in a tomb under what was the First St. George's Church of Kingston.

Mrs. Fraser was the first member of the Kingston branch of the National Council of Women, formed in 1894. The deceased numbered among her close acquaintances the Marquis and Countess of Aberdeen, and not long before her death she received letters from them.




