

Former Monarch Declares Republican Form of Government Not Desired.

London, June 2.—A Rome dispatch to the Exchange Telegraph Company gives an interview which a correspondent had with former King Constantine of Greece. The meeting took place at Salsomag-giore, where the king is taking the cure. Constantine predicted that the elections in Greece would result in the triumph of his party. Asked what he would do in such a case, he replied: "I never abdicated. I simply left Greece during the war. Even the French commissioner, Jonnart, admitted that the powers would not oppose my return if after the war the country called me back. Greece is opposed to a republican form of government. Venizelos knows that."

PERTH COUNTY TAX RATE BETWEEN ONE AND TWO MILLS

The total estimates for the year are \$68,763. Of this \$14,763 is expected from various sources, leaving \$54,000 to be raised by general taxation.

Total, \$50,006.08.
