





Hon, J. S. Duff in LevesWith the Superior District-Chance For Young Men.

Hon, J. S. Duff, provincial minister of agriculture, has returned from a visit to the West Superior district, much impressed with its farming pos-sibilities. He says:

"While I expected to find a fine country, yet it was vastly better than anything I thought possible. In several sections of northwestern Ontario were suitable areas of agricultural land, the greater part of which was both rich and fertile. We found vegetation very well advanced, the crops being

splendid shape in more westerly parts "We found a great deal of land in the vicinity of Dryden and near the cities of Port Arthur and Fort William which are in a free grant district, but which have not yet been taken up, and it seems to me that they offer great inducements to the settler who desires to follow agriculture. In addition to the fertility of the soil he has right at his door almost the immense markets

of those two great cities."

Young Man, go West.

"I was told by the president of the board of trade of Port Arthur that a couple of years ago the two cities imported over \$600,000 worth of the necessities of life, which could have been supplied by the Slate River and other fertile valleys within a short distance of these cities, and, in my judgment any young man with a reasonable amount of energy and perseverance can achieve as great a success in agriculture in this district as he can in older Ontario or the west.

"The outstanding feature of our trip was the splendid optimism and buoyancy which were found everywhere The villages are growing and the cities and towns are growing, land is taken up and the people are prosperous and contented and confident of the

CAPT. SCOTT'S SHIP OVERDUE. LONDON, Aug. 11.-Considerable anxiety is felt for Captain Scott's antarctic expedition ship, the Terra Nova, now eleven days overdue at Cape Town. The vessel has not been spoken since she left Madeira on June 27. Captain Robert F. Scott, commander of the British expedition, which set out on June 1 from London for the South Pole, is not yet aboard the Terra Nova, but left July 16 to join vessel in New Zealand. Lieutenent E. R. Evans is second in command and the other officers and scientists number 28. The crew consists of 27 picked men.

MOVE TO EXTRADITE CHARLTON

NEW YORK, Aug. 11 .- A move was made to-day in behalf of the Italian Government in the case of Porter Charlton, who confessed to having murdered his wife at Lake Como, Italy, and is being held in Jersey City await ing extradition proceedings. PUT OFF TRAIN, DIED.


