



And he adds that no woman sacrifices her dignity in doing such work, says The Worcester Telegram. He explains that the art is not so much in preparing an elaborate menu for a special occasion as in making the regular meals of the family perfect, morning, noon and night. He has evidently come to the conclusion that good living does not take its measure from the expense of the dishes, but from the art in preparing them economically, as well as appetizingly. 


