Budget of Interesting Items Gleaned from Maritime Province Exchanges.

The Maritime Merchant and Halifax Recorder are advocating the union of Halifax and Dartmouth.

The Great Northern Exploration and Development Company, an American concern, has bought the old lead mine at Steveston, N. S., and will begin mining with thirty men and ship one to the South Boston refinery.

The steamer Briandine is due this week at Bridgewater, N. S., to load deals for the Alfred Deeks Co. after half-loading there, the steamer will proceed to Halifax to fill up.

An order-in-council prohibiting, during the years 1906, 1907 and 1908 all fishing except by fishing in Minas Channel, Minas Bay, Cobequid Bay and tributary rivers, streams and waters, and making other restrictions will not be enforced at present, word to that effect having been received from Ottawa.
