Address Given at N. H. S. Meeting

The exceedingly interesting history of Fort Anne in Annapolis Royal and an account of the many treasures its museum contains, were given before the Natural History Society meeting last evening by L. M. Fortier, the honorary superintendent, who has been, in a very large measure, responsible for the fact that the Fort has been preserved and obtained the safe-keeping of some many historic relics. Pictures of the fort were exhibited and lantern views were shown by Dr. William MacIntosh.

I wide George A. Henderson, the results of the treasures, mentioning the 900 pound brass canon of the French period which had been given by the British War Office from Wolwich, when it had been impossible to locate the canons which the British had taken away. The old weather vane removed in 1738 was located in Vermont and brought back. The old key taken by Nicholson was located in the possession of the Massachusetts Historical Society, and that society most generously sent a delegation of three members to return the key in 1922.


