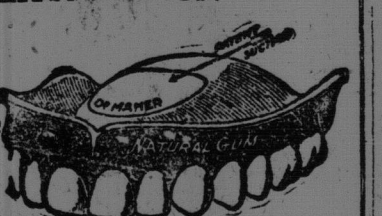

## TO UNDERTAKE CAMPAIGN FOR MISSION FUNDS

A committee, with representatives from each of the Anglican churches in the St. John district, was commissioned at a largely attended meeting of the laymen of the district, held yesterday afternoon in St. John's (Stone) church school which was addressed by Bishop Richardson. This committee is to have charge of a campaign for raising funds for diocesan work and for the M. S. C. C. mission fund. The accumulated shortage of the diocese in these funds amounts to \$12,065 and for the St. John district the shortage is \$2,537. Only three churches in St. John district paid their apportionment last year. They were St. Jude's, St. Mary's and the Church of the Good Shepherd.
